THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF LEICESTER

The County of Leicester (The Green, Ashby de la Zouch) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1959

On the 24th day of November 1959 the Leicester County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles, with certain exceptions, between the hours of 10.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Sundays excepted, in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of road in the Urban District of Ashby de la Zouch

1. On the south side of Elford Street and The Green from the junction of Elford Street with the Ashby de la Zouch to Burton on Trent Road, Route A.50, for a distance of 73 yards in a south easterly direction.

2. On the north side of Elford Street and the west side of The Green for a distance of 94 yards from the junction of Elford Street with the Ashby de la Zouch to Burton on Trent Road, Route A.50.

3. The north side of The Green from its junction with Mill Bank Road for a distance of 69 yards in an easterly direction.

NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949

WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Meriden Rural District

Notice is hereby given that the Warwickshire County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by subsection 3 of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the draft rights of way map and statement prepared under section 27 of the above-mentioned Act in relation to rights of way in the Meriden Rural District by altering to "bridleway" the description of the route described as "road used as public path" referred to in the First Schedule hereto by the number allotted to it in the said draft rights of way map and statement and by altering to "footpath" the description of the routes described as "road used as public path" referred to in the Second Schedule hereto by the said numbers.

Copies of the draft rights of way map and statement for the said district may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Shire Hall, Warwick and at

the Office of the Meriden Rural District Council, Old Bank House, Coleshill.

Any representation or objection with respect to any of these determinations shall be made in writing addressed to the Clerk of the Warwickshire County Council, Shire Hall, Warwick, before the 28th day of December 1959, and shall state the grounds upon which it is made.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Road used as public path to be shown as bridleway
M 23A.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Roads used as public paths to be shown as footpaths.

M 1 from Grounds Farm to its southern end, M 2, M 3, M 6, M 11 from Wishaw Lane westwards, M 24, M 27, M 30, M 58 for a distance of about 380 yards at its eastern end, M 59 from Coleshill Railway Station to Gorseley Lane and for a distance of about 480 yards at its eastern end, M 83, M 135 from Ryton End Farm to its southern end, M 141 from Fen End Road to Balsall Lodge Farm, M 143, M 169, M 201 from Duggins Lane to the railway, M 207 for so much of its length as follows the drive to The Moat, M 219 from Berkswell Road to Blind Hall Farm, M 222 for a distance of 210 yards from its southern end, M 226 for a distance of 150 yards from its western end, M 230 for a distance of 370 yards at its northern end, M 335, M 395 from its northern end until it turns east and leaves the Birmingham—Derby Railway, M 403, M 423A, M 444 from Firtree Lane to Church Lane.

AMERSHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

*Amersham Rural District (Chartridge No. 1)
Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th November 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order will be to divert part of footpath No. 52 commencing on the eastern boundary of field No. 1456 at a point approximately 130 feet south of the northern boundary of this field and proceeding in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,000 feet, past Great Hundridge Farm, to the south-eastern corner of field No. 1459 to a line commencing on the eastern boundary of field No. 1456 thence in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 130 feet to the south-eastern corner of field No. 1452 thereafter in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,080 feet to the south-western corner of field No. 1452, so removing the path from the private grounds of Great Hundridge Farm and allowing the agricultural field No. 1456 to be more economically used.

A certified copy of this Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Office of the Clerk, Council Offices, 42 High Street, Amersham, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays except Saturdays, when it will be available from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation as a result of the coming into operation of this Order should apply in writing to the address given below before the 27th day of May 1960.

The Order becomes operative as from the 3rd day of December 1959, but if any person is aggrieved by the Order and desires to question the validity thereof or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
