

## WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*Survey of Rights of Way**Warwick Rural District*

Notice is hereby given that the Warwickshire County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the draft rights of way map and statement, prepared under section 27 of the above-mentioned Act, in relation to the rights of way in the Warwick Rural District by the deletion of forty-one footpaths and one road used as a public path, the addition of eleven footpaths and one bridleway, the redesignation of two footpaths and nine roads used as public paths as bridleways, and of forty roads used as public paths as footpaths and by altering the line of two footpaths.

Maps and statements showing the modifications have been deposited at the Shire Hall, Warwick, at the Office of the Clerk of the Warwick Rural District Council, 1 Warwick New Road, Leamington Spa and at the Police Headquarters, Leek Wootton, and may be inspected free of charge on any weekday during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the above-mentioned determinations shall be made in writing addressed to the Clerk of the Warwickshire County Council, Shire Hall, Warwick, before the 14th day of March 1960, and shall state the grounds upon which it is made.

*Walthamstow (Waterhall Avenue and Betoynne Avenue Path) Extinguishment Order, 1958*

*Gloucester Rural District Council (Trevor Road, Hucclecote) Extinguishment Order, 1959*

## EAST ASHFORD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

*East Ashford Rural District Council Diversion Order No. 1 (Boughton Aluph), 1960*

The above Order made on the 2nd day of February 1960, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert a part of the public right of way running from Sandyhurst Lane, Boughton Aluph (between "Resanna" and "Dunister") to Bockhanger Lane, Kennington, from a point just to the north of the duck breeding houses, two hundred and thirty yards south of Sandyhurst Lane, in a south-easterly direction for a distance of two hundred and ninety yards to a line running from the point just to the north of the duck breeding houses in an easterly direction for a distance of seventy-five yards, thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and thirty yards and thence in a southerly direction for a distance of one hundred and forty-five yards to connect with the original footpath leading to Kennington.
